Eligibility & Requirements

- Possession of, or eligibility for, an Education Specialist Degree or higher, and holds or is eligible for a Georgia Standard Professional Clear Renewable Tier II Certificate at Level 6 or higher in Educational Leadership. A certificate number or letter of eligibility from the Georgia Professional Standards Commission as verification of such eligibility must be provided. - Must possess good moral character and have no criminal convictions.involving moral turpitude, as required by GA law; possession of high standards of ethical and moral conduct and a demonstrated ability to promote the success of all students by adhering to ethical principles and professional norms.
- Has no immediate family members serving on the Stewart County Board of Education or employed as an administrator in the school district after July 1, 2009, as required by GA law.
- Demonstrated effective leadership in similar demographic environments, with a history of progressively responsible roles that showcase increasing expertise and responsibility.
